Northwest Coast Indians

- 1. Carved images of totems like ancestors or animal spirits on tall wooden poles called totem poles
- 2. Held feasts of wealth called potlatches
- 3. Food: salmon, bears, sea otter, whales, other wild game and wild plants
- 4. Clothing: woven cedar blankets, hats, boots and animal skins.
- 5. Shelter: cedar plank longhouses
- 6. Artifacts: wooden masks, woven baskets, obsidian tools/arrowheads

Eastern Woodland Indians

- 1. Iroquois were a major group-formed Iroquois, a confederation of 5 groups of Iroquois tribes
- 2. Invented lacrosse-Iroquois called it "Little War"
- 3. Traveled in dugout canoes
- 4. Food: corn, beans, squash, deer, elk, other wild game and wild plants
- 5. Clothing: animal skins
- 6. Shelter: wigwams and longhouses
- 7. Artifacts: arrowheads/tools made of flint, birch bark baskets

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Southwest Indians

- 1. Dry climate made life very difficult
- 2. Developed irrigation methods to grow crops
- 3. Built kivas, underground chambers, for religious ceremonies.
- 4. Worshipped figures called kachinas
- 5. Food: maize (corn), beans, squash, small wild game
- 6. Clothing: woven plants and animal skins
- 7. Shelter: pueblos made of adobe
- 8. Artifacts: pottery, woven baskets, obsidian spear points, kachina dolls

Great Plains Indians

- 1. Largest North American Indian region-mostly grasslands
- Entire culture revolved around the buffalo
- 3. Nomadic hunters-used travois to follow buffalo
- Greatest horse culture of all Native Americans
- 5. Food: buffalo, wild plants
- 6. Clothing: animal skins
- 7. Shelter: tepees
- 8. Artifacts: shields, bone needles and knives, arrowheads of flint and chert
