3.	Columbus grew up listening to the tales of <u>Sea Captains</u>
	and the travels of <u>Marco Polo</u> .
4.	Columbus is said to have read Marco Polo's
	many times.

5.	After Portugal began to lead the way in
	exploration, the country of <u>Spain</u> , Portugal's rival,
	decided they wanted to beat the rest of Europe, especially
	Portugal, in finding the Shortest water route to India
	(Asia).
6.	Columbus was turned down by his native
	<u>Italy</u> when he <u>petitioned</u> the king for
	<u>Financial</u> backing to make his journey.
7.	Finally, after <u>Several</u> years of making his case to
	Spain, King <u>Ferdinand</u> , and Queen <u>Isabella</u>
	gave Columbus the money, Ships, and
_	<u>Crew</u> to set out.
8.	Since he knew the world was <u>found</u> , as most people did
	during this time, Columbus believed if he sailed West
	across the Atlantic, he would eventually reach

of Columbus's mistake.
15. Later, other <u>explorers</u> would prove Columbus
did not reach India, but had indeed discovered
continents previously unknown to <u>Europeans</u> .
16. Until his <u>death</u> in 1566, Columbus refused
to accept he had not reached India.

17. When Columbus returned to <u>Spain</u> after his first
journey there, he took around 500 native people
from the island of Guanahani, and what is today

and Queen.
18. Columbus made more trips to the Bahamas, and to

19. Another Spanish explorer, Hernando de Soto, also	
traveled to the Americas and explored much of what is today	
the <u>Southeastern</u> United States; he <u>Claimed</u> the land	
for Spain.	
20. Hernando de Soto was with Francisco Pizarro when he	
destroyed the <u>Incan Empire</u> .	
21. De Soto was the <u>First</u> European to see the <u>Mississippi</u> River

25. In the late 1500s, Spanish exploration began to <u>Settle</u>	
down.	,
26. However, there were many Spanish <u>Colonies</u> in the	
Americas that had been created and "given" by the King of	F
Spain as a: Fls to those with Double and	,
Spain as <u>a: Fts</u> to those with <u>power</u> and <u>influence</u> .	
27. Although these colonies were in North and South	
America, they were collectively called Alant South	
America, they were collectively called New Spain	
28. Few Spanish <u>Colonists</u> came to New Spain to	
begin a new <u>life</u> ; most came to <u>pillage</u> silver and <u>gold</u> and become <u>Wealthy</u> .

29. They set up huge <u>Plantations</u>, and used <u>enslaved</u> Native American Indians to both <u>farm</u> the plantations and mine for the silver and gold.

30. After most of the enslaved Indians <u>died</u> from <u>Overwork</u> and <u>disease</u>, the Spanish looked for another labor force.

31. The Spanish colonists began to <u>enslave</u> people captured by their own people and <u>Sold</u> in

Htrica

32. This is how <u>Slavery</u> began in the United States. These enslaved people were brought to the <u>New Spain</u> against their <u>Will</u>.

33. Now that North and South America had been <u>Ciscovered</u> and colonized, Europeans were still hungry to find a shorter <u>Water</u> route to India. This was known as the <u>Northwest</u> Passage.



Spain rewarded many of the **conquistadors** by giving them land in the Americas. Most of the land was in **Mexico**. The Spaniards called Mexico, **New Spain**.
